Newport's 1st Aviation Career Education Academy

Parlin Field formed a partnership with the Newport school district to bring aviation education to 42 youth from the surrounding communities for



a week long program which ran from August 3 - 7.

The Federal Aviation Administration sponsored Aviation Career Education program, or ACE for short, aims to introduce kids to the many different career opportunities in aviation. Through the combined efforts of several Newport school teachers and the many volunteers from Parlin Field, the effort was successful by any measure.

The students were treated to a schedule packed with hands on aviation related instruction and activities. Throughout the week students took flights in privately owned general aviation aircraft, had lessons in navigation, aircraft systems and components, and principles of flight and learned about basic aerodynamics through model aircraft and rocket building. Students also went on a variety of aviation related field trips; spoke to numerous guest speakers,

and even got to experience a mobile planetarium. We are already planning for next year!

Runway Light Work



After the excitement of the ACE academy, it was back to work for us. An electrical short in the southeast quadrant of runway lights caused a failure of 9 runway lights and 3 threshold lights. The team at Parlin was on the problem, digging up multiple runway lights in search of the short. Unfortunately it was a fruitless

effort. It wasn't until the Town of Newport Water Department lent us a tone generator, that the Parlin team was able to quickly find and repair the short.

During the repair, a method was devised to better access the connections at each fixture, allowing for easier repairs in the future. It was another great reminder of the outstanding volunteers and people we are so fortunate to have at Parlin. It also made us VERY grateful for the stake mounted solar taxiway lights from AvLite. Since there is no buried wiring, we never have to worry about digging them up to find a short!

We have already begun the process to convert the runway markings for Runway 36 from a visual to non-precision instrument approach runway. The new markings will be completed in early summer 2015
