Fire Chief Aircraft Accident Seminar

Local fire chiefs and firefighters received hands-on instruction regarding hazards to first responders at aircraft accident sites from Parlin Field team members Rick Kloeppel, Russ Kelsea, and John Merriman. The seminar covered typical aircraft accidents, aircraft systems and structures, and modern safety features installed in some airplanes such as Ballistic Recovery Systems (BRS) and aircraft airbags that can pose significant hazards to first responders. The instruction included a seminar followed by hands-on training with several general aviation aircraft. This class was well attended by fire and EMT personnel from several area fire departments.

Runway 12-30 seasonal closing

It's that time of year again when the days are short, nights are long and our airplane engines require a bit of pre-heating before biting into the crisp winter air and launching us aloft. Yes, the time has come when we pull up the yellow cones that mark the edges of our turf runway. The runway will officially be closed on Friday, November 15th by NOTAM as well as notation in the FAA Airport Facilities Directory. Our paved Runway 18-36 will remain open as always (less several trees within the approach) so please come on by for a hot bowl of chili from the Lil' Red Baron during the winter months. The turf runway will reopen

for operations in May.
