

Newport's 250th Discovery Challenge Photo Contest 2011

General Information

The 250th committee of the Newport Historical Society is welcoming individuals, groups, amateurs or professionals of all ages on this local adventure that will lead participants to places of historic, cultural and community significance that has helped shape Newport and now - you. Selected contest images will be embedded in a slide show presentation format identifying the *Treasure*, and the contributor and presented through a variety of outlets including Local Cable NCTV, the Newport Historical Society Web Site and be used for other Newport Historical Society presentations.

All that participate should consider themselves winners however; two different contributors who present the most outstanding efforts will each receive a copy of ***Celebrating Community - Newport, New Hampshire: 250 Years and Beyond, 1761-2011***, written by Newport native Jayna Huot Hooper, in partnership with The Newport Historical Society and the *Eagle Times*. The winners will be identified at the play "Our Town" which will be presented on November 18, 19 and 20th, 2011 at the Newport Opera House and also be posted on the Newport Historical Society Web site at www.newportnhhistory.org as well as the Town of Newport Web site www.newportnh.net.

Here are the rules:

1. Participants may submit some or all treasures.
2. Please be respectful of people and property and leave all treasures in their natural condition.
3. Judging will be based on "best overall efforts". You are encouraged to add your perspective, interpretation or artistry in the image.
4. Color, documentary style black and white, sepia tones, costumes, props and characters will all be eligible.
5. All Photos must be in a common digital format (jpeg, jpg etc.)
6. Photo Credit required for all photos (especially if not submitted by the photographer).
7. Identify the "Treasure" number with the image (we have to know which image is which).
8. Please submit a photo of the photographer also.
9. On Friday, September 30th, copies of the treasures to be found may be picked up at:
