Sir,

Having been
appointed Dr. Master in the 31st Reg. and taken the
oath of allegiance and of office according to law I return
a receipt of assortment of blanks as soon as I was
thus qualified. Having been informed that Mr. Jacob
Dow late Capt. of a company in this town termed
the "Bold Rangers" had in his possession several arti-
cles of public property consisting of a lot of blanks
orderly and roll books a drum &c. I called for them.
He brought forward and delivered to me a lot of blanks
orderly & roll books &c. These he declares are all the articles
of State property in his possession except a snare drum
He says that one head of the drum was broken & uncer-
wieldy when he received it; that he put in a head put

in an his own expence a head at a cost of 75 cts
He refuses to give up the Drum till he receives 50 cts
or he will take out the head and give up the rest. As
I could not either pay him for the head or allow
him to take it out of a Drum belonging to the State
I report him accordingly. I have not received from
him any Infantry Regulations Abstract of Infantry
Tactics or Militia Laws nor have any of his
successors in office. It is believed that some
of his Subalterns have two or more copies of Infantry
Regulations Abstract of Infantry Tactics &c still
in their possession. I wait till I receive your orders
